Steps for New Degree-Seeking Students:

Are you new to the college? Do you plan to pursue a degree, diploma, or certificate program? If the answer is “yes” to both of the questions, follow these steps below to complete the process of enrollment into Durham Tech.

All new students who plan to enroll in a program and wish to register for one or more curriculum courses should complete the admissions process and see an advisor prior to registering for courses. Spring Early Advising and Registration options are available to students until November 30, 2006. After this date, the only option is General Advising and Registration on January 4 – 5, 2007. Avoid long lines and closed courses associated with General Registration! Start this process early!

1. **Attend an Orientation.**

Orientation is your opportunity to understand how Durham Tech can help you reach your educational or career goals, understand the advising and registration process, learn about the various resources available to help support you during this transition, and receive a checklist to see that you have prepared well for this important transition. Please refer to the [Orientation Schedule](#) for more information about orientation dates, times, and locations.

2. **Submit an application.**

Applications are available in the Admissions Office or [online](#). This is the first step for beginning the process of admission to a degree, certificate, or diploma program.

3. **If You're Planning To Apply for Financial Aid, Start Now.**

If you are interested in financial aid, it's important to know that the application process can take up to five weeks, especially during registration periods. It is best to have completed the entire process prior to registering for courses. Students are often unaware of the various documentation and other steps required to complete this process, so getting an early start is essential. Pick up an application for financial aid in the Financial Aid office, room 1209 of the Wynn Center or get more information by reviewing the [Financial Aid section](#) of the web site.

4. **Request your transcripts.**

Request that your official transcript from high school be sent to Durham Tech. If you have earned the GED, submit an official copy of your test scores (use the Durham Tech "Request for Transcript" form). Request that official college transcripts be sent to Durham Tech if you desire an evaluation for transfer credit. Note: Applicants who submit an official transcript documenting completion of a 2-year or 4-year college degree will not be required to submit a high school transcript.

5. **Take the placement tests.**

Your admissions counselor will let you know which tests are necessary for your program. If you need testing accommodations due to a documented disability, contact a disability services counselor at 919-686-3652.

6. **Schedule an appointment to see an advisor.**

If you plan to register for Spring Semester courses, your next step is to visit or telephone the Advising Center beginning Monday, October 9, 2006. The Advising Center is located in room 1200 of the Wynn Center on Durham Tech's Main Campus. Appointments for new students begin November 8, 2006, and continue through November 30, 2006. Appointments are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. You can visit the Advising Center or call 919-686-3348 to learn more about appointment availability and to schedule your appointment.

7. **Prepare for your first advising appointment.**

Once you have made your appointment, prepare by creating a file of important documents. In your file, include a copy of your placement test scores and any previous college transcripts (unofficial copies are fine for advising purposes) you might have that would indicate possible transfer credit. Some students assume that the college will have everything processed at the time of your first advising appointment. This may not necessarily be accurate. To avoid any confusion, it's essential to bring a file of your own documentation with you to every advising appointment to ensure that you can enroll in appropriate courses. In addition, take time prior to meeting with your advisor to review the course schedule and courses that might be closed by visiting the closed course list.

8. **Meet your advisor.**

Your advising appointment is important. Your advisor will help you develop a plan for how to meet your academic goals and what courses to take for the upcoming semester. Since new and special students must satisfy all course prerequisites, make sure to bring documentation of your placement test scores or any unofficial college transcripts to your advising appointment. At the end of your appointment, you will complete your registration form and receive a personal identification number (PIN) giving you permission to register using our telephone registration system (TECHLINE).

9. **Register for Your Courses Using TECHLINE.**

After meeting with your advisor, you'll have everything you need to dial into TECHLINE, Durham Tech's telephone registration system, and register for your courses. Directions for TECHLINE are printed on your registration form. You can register for your classes using a home, cell, or TECHLINE phone (located in student lounges). If TECHLINE is busy when you call, continue trying the TECHLINE phone number (919-686-3722) until you get through. Remember, once you are using TECHLINE, you will have 10 minutes to complete your call. It's important to **NOT hang up without entering "9" to end the call**. Entering "9" is necessary to complete your registration.

TECHLINE will be open for new degree-seeking students **Mondays through Fridays beginning Wednesday, November 8, and ending Monday, December 4**. TECHLINE is available **Mondays through Thursdays from 9 a.m. to midnight and on Fridays from 9 a.m. to noon. On Monday, December 4, TECHLINE will only be available from 9 a.m. to noon**. TECHLINE is available to all students who have been advised for Spring Semester 2007.

10. **Pay Your Tuition.**

After you've registered using TECHLINE, you'll have until 4 p.m. on Monday, December 4, 2006 to settle your account. Although the deadline is not until December 4, you can settle your account any time after you have registered. More information is available on the [Paying Tuition and Fees page](#).

11. **Get Ready for Class.**

Spring classes begin **Monday, January 8, 2007**. Get ready by [buying your books](#) and everything else you'll need to be successful for your first day of class.

Steps for Admitted Students:

Are you returning to the college? Have you been admitted to a program? Have you been assigned an advisor? If the answer is "yes" to all three of these questions, take the following steps to be advised and registered for the next semester:

1. **Schedule an appointment to see your academic advisor.**

If you plan to register for Spring Semester courses, your first step is to contact your assigned advisor beginning Monday, October 9, 2006, to schedule an advising appointment. Students who meet with their assigned advisors prior to November 3 are eligible to register using TECHLINE on November 6 and November 7, which are special TECHLINE "Reward Registration Days" for curriculum students. Returning students may continue to make appointments to see assigned advisors and register using TECHLINE until November 30, 2006. However, advisor's appointment books fill up fast; so don't wait until it's too late. If you cannot recall the name or contact information for your assigned advisor, contact the Advising Center at 919-686-3348.

2. **Meet with your academic advisor.**

During your meeting with your academic advisor you will discuss your plan of study and plan your next semester courses.

3. **Register for your courses using TECHLINE.**

After meeting with your assigned academic advisor, you'll have everything you need to dial into TECHLINE, Durham Tech's telephone registration system, and register for your courses.

Directions for using TECHLINE are printed on your registration form. You can register for your classes using a home, cell, or TECHLINE phone (located in student lounges). If TECHLINE is busy when you call, continue trying the TECHLINE phone number (919-686-3722) until you get through. Remember, once you are using TECHLINE, you will have 10 minutes to complete your call. It's important to **NOT hang up without entering "9" to end the call**. Entering "9" is necessary to complete your registration.

TECHLINE will be open for admitted students **Mondays through Fridays beginning Monday, November 6, and ending Monday, December 4**. TECHLINE is available **Mondays through Thursdays from 9 a.m. to midnight and on Fridays from 9 a.m. to noon. On Monday, December 4, TECHLINE will only be available from 9 a.m. to noon**. Don't forget that Monday, November 6, and Tuesday November 7, are reserved "Reward Registration Days" for admitted students who have met early with their assigned advisors for Spring Semester 2007.

4. **Pay your tuition.**

After you've registered using TECHLINE, you'll have until 4 p.m. on Monday, December 4, 2006 to settle your account. Although the deadline is not until December 4, you can settle your account any time after you have registered. More information is available on the [Paying Tuition and Fees page](#).

5. **Get ready for class.**

Spring classes begin **Monday, January 8, 2007**. Get ready by [buying your books](#) and everything else you'll need to be successful for your first day of class.

Answers to Common Questions of Admitted Students

How do I find out if I have an assigned advisor?

Visit the Advising Center, located in room 1200 of the Wynn Center, or call 919-686-3348 and an Advising Center staff member can check to see if you have an assigned advisor.

How will I know who my advisor is?

If you have been officially admitted into a Durham Technical Community College degree, diploma, or certificate program, you will receive a letter in the mail informing you who your advisor is and giving you his or her phone number, office number, and email address. This letter is the only time you will receive a reminder of when to see your advisor and register.

What if I forget who my advisor is?

You can visit the Advising Center, located in room 1200 of the Wynn Center, or call 919-686-3348 and an Advising Center staff member will provide you with your assigned advisor's info

Steps for Non-Degree-Seeking Students:

Are you planning on taking just a few courses at Durham Tech? Are you not interested in getting a degree, diploma, or certificate? Do you just want a few credits to transfer to some other college? If the answer is “yes” to all three of these questions, follow these steps to see an advisor and register for courses.

All students who wish to register for one or more curriculum courses must see an advisor prior to registering for courses. Spring Early Advising and Registration options are available to students until November 30, 2006. After this date, the only option is General Advising and Registration on January 4 and January 5, 2007. Avoid long lines and closed courses associated with General Registration! Make an appointment to see an advisor early!

Answers to Common Questions of Non-Degree-Seeking Students

Do I have to meet with an advisor?

Yes. If you are interested in taking courses at Durham Technical Community College, you must meet with an advisor before you can register for courses.

What will happen when I meet with an advisor?

When you meet with an advisor, he or she will review the list of courses you are interested in taking, answer any questions you have, help you plan out a course schedule, and check that you have met the prerequisites for any courses you are interested in taking.

What should I bring to my advising appointment?

As a special student, be sure to bring a copy of transcripts if you have attended another college, a copy of your placement test scores, and a list of courses you are interested in taking.

Steps for Durham Technical Community College Nursing Students:

Do you plan to pursue a nursing degree at Durham Tech? If “yes,” follow the steps here to enroll at Durham Tech. These steps are appropriate for students who are interested in enrolling in nursing; are new degree-seeking nursing students; or have been admitted into the developmental, preparatory, or wait list status for the Associate Degree Nursing or Practical Nursing programs at Durham Technical Community College.

We’re glad that you are preparing for a career in nursing at Durham Technical Community College! Please carefully read the following information about your appropriate early advising and registration options to make the right connections for advising. Early advising options are available to nursing students until November 29, 2006.

Advising Options for New Durham Tech Nursing Curriculum Students

(Students who are interested in or are a new degree-seeking student for the Associate Degree Nursing or Practical Nursing Programs at Durham Technical Community College)

1. Prepare for your first semester.

- If you haven't yet completed an application, consider submitting your application to Durham Technical Community College. The Admissions Office is located in room 1210 of the Wynn Center or you can [apply online](#).
- If you haven't yet attended a Pre-Nursing Seminar, consider attending this important seminar to learn more about the wait list and other specific requirements for the nursing programs. Review the [Pre-Nursing Seminar schedule](#) for more information.
- If you haven't yet attended a Durham Technical Community College Orientation, consider attending to learn about Durham Tech and the services and programs that are available to you. Please refer to the [Orientation schedule](#) for more information about Orientation dates, times, and locations.
- If you are planning to pursue a nursing education at Durham Tech, you must complete the Compass Placement Test or ASSET Test regardless of your previous educational background. Review the [placement test schedules](#) for more specific information.
- If you are interested in financial aid, it's important to know that the application process can take up to five weeks, especially during registration periods. Students should complete the entire process prior to registering for courses. Review the [financial aid](#) section for more information.
- Start a file of important documents. In your file, include a copy of your placement test scores, your notice of acceptance, and any previous college transcripts you might have that would indicate possible transfer credit. You should have this file of documents with you whenever you meet with an advisor.
- Take time prior to meeting with an advisor to review the course schedule and

possible courses that might be full by visiting the [closed course list](#).

- If you'd like, you may also take time to visit the Advising Center in room 1210 of the Wynn Center on Durham Tech's Main Campus. If you visit, you will receive new student information including a current course schedule and a plan of study.

2. Attend a Nursing Advising Session.

Nursing advisors will help you develop a plan for how to meet your academic goals and plan for what courses to take for the upcoming semester. Important: Bring a copy of your placement test scores to your advising session. You will not be advised if you have not completed the placement test. At the end of your advising session, you will complete your registration form and receive a personal identification number giving you permission to register using our telephone registration system. Spring Semester nursing advising sessions are all scheduled in room 910 of the GlaxoWellcome Technology Center on Durham Tech's Main Campus and will occur on the following dates and times:

Advising Options for Admitted Durham Tech Nursing Curriculum Students

Nursing students may be advised during any of the following sessions held in room 910 of the GlaxoWellcome Technology Center on Durham Tech's Main Campus. Students don't need to make an appointment; just come during one of the following times. Students should take time prior to meeting with an advisor to review the course schedule and possible courses that might be full by taking a look at the [closed course list](#). Students can come to any session for advising and be advised by any nursing faculty advisor. All sessions will be held in room 910 of the GlaxoWellcome Technology Center. Students who have been advised by November 3, 2006, can take advantage of TECHLINE Reward Days on November 6 and November 7, 2006.

Steps for General Advising and Registration

Did you miss the opportunity to meet with an advisor and register early? If you were unable to see an advisor and register for courses prior to November 30, 2006, General Advising and Registration is your only option for enrolling in Spring Semester courses.

Main Campus General Advising and Registration

General Registration dates and times are Thursday, January 4, and Friday, January 5, 2007, 9 – 2 p.m. and 4 – 6 p.m. See [advising locations](#) listed below.

Every student is required to see an advisor to discuss course selection and receive approval as your first step prior to registering for courses. Locations of advisors are listed here. New degree-seeking students, admitted students, and nursing students should visit the advising location appropriate to your program. Non-degree-seeking students (special students) should visit the advising location most closely related to the courses they are interested in taking.

All students, regardless of admission status, must satisfy course prerequisites. Documentation is required. To make sure you can register for the courses you need, bring copies of your placement test scores and college transcripts with you to advising. Follow the steps below to be advised and register during General Advising and Registration.

1. **Get prepared for General Advising and Registration.**

Prepare for general registration by starting a file of important documents. In your file, include a copy of your placement test scores, your notice of acceptance (if applicable), and any previous college transcripts you might have that would indicate possible transfer credit. Take time to review the course schedule and possible closed courses by visiting Durham Tech's [closed course list](#) at least one day before registration.

2. **If you're planning to use Financial Aid, know the deadlines.**

Only those students who have completed the admission process are eligible for financial aid. For new degree-seeking students, admitted students, and Durham Tech nursing students interested in financial aid, it's important to know that the application process can take up to five weeks, especially during registration periods. Students must complete the entire financial aid process prior to registering for courses in order to receive financial aid. Students are often unaware of the various documentation and other steps required to complete this process, so starting this process at least five weeks prior to registration is essential. Pick up an application for financial aid in the Financial Aid office, room 1209A of the Wynn Center, or get more information by viewing the [Financial Aid section](#) of the web site.

3. **Start your day in the appropriate advising location.**

On January 4 and January 5, advisors will be available from 9 a.m. – 2 p.m. and from 4 – 6 p.m. to help you select courses for the Spring Semester. Locations for advising are listed below. Make sure to bring your file of important documentation so that you will be able to register for the courses most appropriate for you.

Advising locations are separated by the degree, diploma, certificate, or courses you are interested in taking. Please take time to review the Advising Locations listed here to make sure you begin in the correct location.

Advising Locations for General Advising and Registration

Business and Public Service Technologies: White Building, room 49

Students pursuing the following programs or interested in taking courses with the following prefixes should start at this location:

Programs: Accounting; Early Childhood Associate; Animal Care Management; Teacher Associate; Business Administration; Emergency Preparedness Technology; Business Administration; Environment, Health, and Safety Technology; Operations Management; Fire Protection Technology; Criminal Justice Technology; and Paralegal Technology.

Course Prefixes: ACC, BUS, CJC, ECM, EDU, EHS, EMS, EPT, FIP, INT, LEX, MKT as well as prerequisite ENG, RED, and MAT courses.

Health Technologies: GlaxoWellcome Technology Center, room 941

Students pursuing the following programs or interested in taking courses with the following prefixes should start at this location:

Programs: Associate Degree Nursing, Clinical Trials Research Associate, Dental Laboratory

Technology, Occupational Therapy Assistant, Opticianry, Pharmacy Technology, Practical Nursing, Respiratory Therapy, and Surgical Technology.

Course Prefixes: CTR, DLT, OPH, OTA, NUR, PBT, PHM, RCP, SUR as well as prerequisite ENG, RED, and MAT courses

Industrial/Engineering Technologies: Newton Building, room 414

Students pursuing the following programs or interested in taking courses with the following prefixes should start at this location:

Programs: Architectural Technology, Automotive Systems Technology, Electrical/Electronics Technology, Electronics Engineering Technology, Industrial Systems Technology, and Machining Technology.

Course Prefixes: ARC, AHR, AUT, BPR, CET, DFT, EGR, ELC, ELN, ISC, MAC, MEC, MNT, PLU, WLD as well as prerequisite ENG, RED, and MAT courses.

Information Systems Technologies: GlaxoWellcome Technology Center, room 903

Students pursuing the following programs or interested in taking courses with the following prefixes should start at this location:

Programs: Computer Programming, Computer Information Technology, Health Information Technology, Networking Technology, Information Systems Security, Medical Office Administration, Office Systems Technology, and Web Technologies.

Course Prefixes: CIS, CSC, CTS, DBA, HIT, MED, NET, OST, SEC, and WEB as well as prerequisite ENG, RED, and MAT courses.

University Transfer, General Education, Biotechnology, and Community Spanish Facilitator: Educational Resources Center, Auditorium

Students pursuing the following programs or interested in taking courses with the following prefixes should start at this location:

Programs: Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, Associate in General Education, Biotechnology, Community Spanish Facilitator, and Spanish Language Certificate.

Course Prefixes: University Transfer courses, BTC, SPI as well as prerequisite ENG, RED, and MAT courses

Dual Enrollment: Phillips Building, room 381 – On January 5 ONLY!

Qualified high school students 16 years old and older may register for dual enrollment courses (on January 5 only). Students must meet all of the requirements and prerequisites for the courses they plan to take. High school students graduating in January of 2007 are not considered “dual enrolled” for Spring courses. Call Mary Anne Grabarek at 686-3413 for more information.

4. **Register for your courses.**

Immediately after you meet with an advisor, you will register for your selected courses at one of three locations: Phillips Building, room 309; GlaxoWellcome Technology Center, room 952; or

Due to the high volume of student traffic, registration can take time. Come prepared for a wait (or register early using TECHLINE).

5. Pay your tuition.

Upon being entered into your courses, visit the payment locations as your next step. You have many options for payment including cash, check, and charge. It is important to note that if you are receiving financial aid or other agency support, you are still required settle your tuition account in person. You must pay the full tuition bill by 6 p.m. on the same day that you register. If you do not pay by 6 p.m., your registration will be removed from the system at the end of the day for others to register. Don't let this happen to you. Be prepared to pay on the day that you register.

6. Get Ready for Class.

Spring classes begin **Monday, January 8, 2007**. Get ready by buying your books and everything else you'll need to be successful for your first day of class.

Registration is also available at other Durham Tech sites. If you plan to register at a location other than the Main Campus, please read carefully the following information:

Northern Durham Center General Registration
